With these thoughts in mind, our 7th grade advisory would like you to consider this: what have you done to be friendly today?



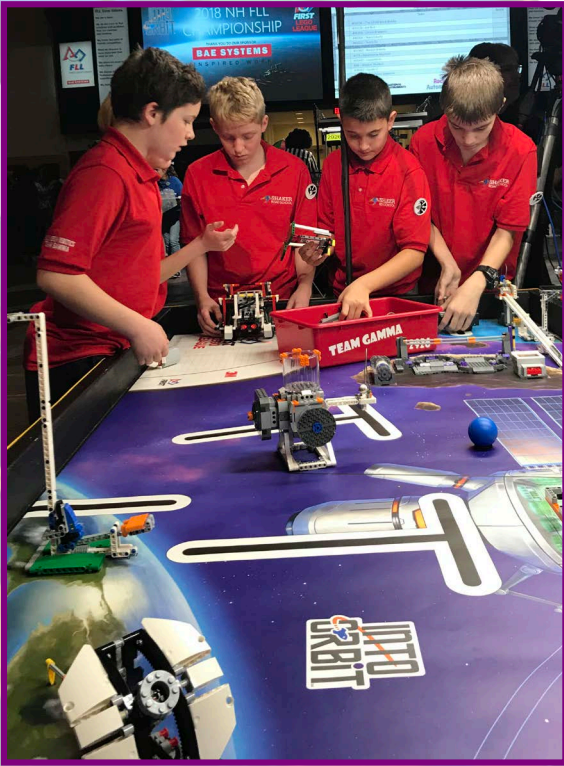
LEGO League 2018

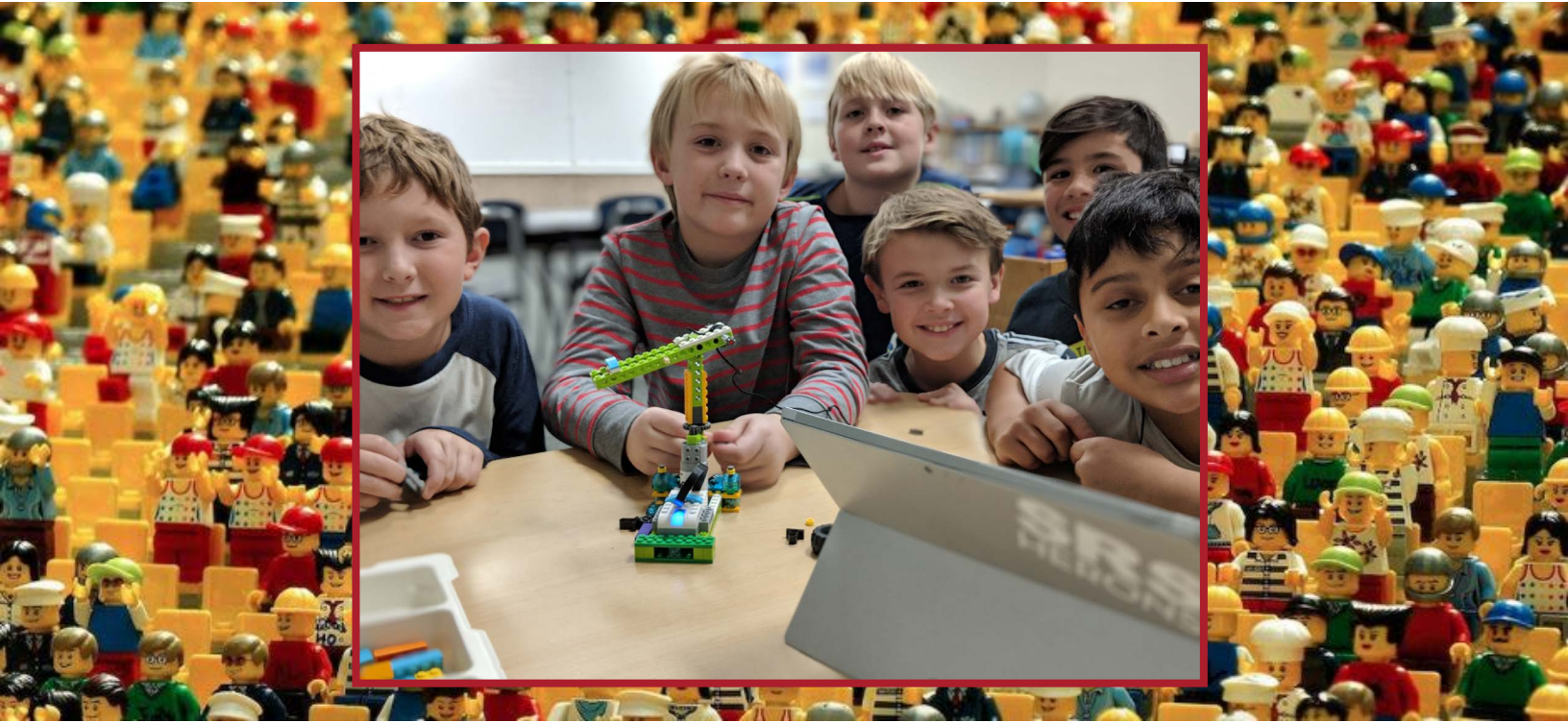
This year, Shaker Road School had 31 middle school students on five teams compete in the FIRST LEGO League Qualifying Tournament in Gilford, NH. These teams worked at least twice a week from September through November until their tournament. At the end of the competition, Team Beta earned Presentation Award, Team Delta earned the Robot Design Award, and Team Gamma earned the Robot Performance Award (high score award). Of the five teams, Team Gamma (a team of six 8th grade students and one 6th grader), Team Epsilon (a team of five 7th graders), and Team Delta (a team of three 8th graders and three 7th graders) earned invitations to the State Championship Tournament in December for the chance to compete with the other top teams in the state. Our rookie team, Team Alpha, made a great showing at their first tournament. They programmed multiple missions for their robot, put together a great project, and had fun while gaining valuable experience at the tournament. We can't wait to see what they do next year!

The theme for the 2018-2019 season was Into Orbit. Along with building and programming a robot to autonomously complete mission challenges, the teams were asked to design an innovative solution to solve a problem an astronaut may face during long-term space travel. More than 32,000 teams in 88 nations competed in this challenge hoping to earn an invitation to the World Festival competition through their local Championship Tournaments.

This year's NH State Championship Tournament was held at Windham High School on December 2. After a full day of excellent competition Teams Gamma, Delta, and Epsilon finished 13th, 37th, and 43rd respectively. Over 300 teams from New Hampshire participated in the Regional Tournaments, and 50 were invited to the State Tournament. It was truly an honor to have multiple teams represent Shaker Road School at the state level again this year. This was Shaker Road School's 18th year competing in the FIRST LEGO League challenge. If you'd like more information on how the program works at Shaker Road School or are interested in helping coach a team, please let us know. LEGO League

3rd & 4th Grade

Shaker Road School has been a part of the FIRST LEGO League (FLL) for over a decade. Each year we have several teams from grades 5-8 participate in the league. Our younger students see the LEGO robots and are always eager to get involved! This year, to give our third- and fourth-grade students the opportunity to participate, we joined FIRST LEGO League Junior.

FLL Jr. introduces students to FLL and gives them an opportunity to learn what the program is about. This year, teams were given the task of creating a moon base and incorporating their solution to the problem of getting air, energy, and water while living on the moon. Our two teams, Zeta and Eta, spent time all fall researching the moon, designing their own moon base, engineering a solution to the problem they chose to solve, and programming their robots.

Both teams are excited to attend the FIRST LEGO League Junior Expo at Hollis Brookline High School on Saturday, December 8. At the Expo all participating teams will present their "Show Me" boards to a panel of judges and share their moon base design and answer questions.

Classroom of the Month: Spanish

The Spanish program at SRS focuses on authentic culture and real-life communication using Spanish. Students in grades pre-K-K3 through 9th practice grade-appropriate reading, writing, listening, and speaking and are introduced to cultural facets typical of many Spanish speaking countries. Students employ critical thinking skills as they compare the Spanish language and the cultures of Spanish-speaking countries with their own community. They also connect to other academic subjects by using their knowledge of Spanish to access new information.

If you stop by any of the Spanish classes, you will find the students—beyond their regular practice of reading, writing, and speaking Spanish—singing songs while being a choo-choo train, coloring while learning the names of colors, making next year's calendar for the classroom, filming a movie, or dancing Zumba style. All these activities help students to build knowledge and skills to create a solid foundation in Spanish language and culture.
